





1916 Recognition of the expatriate Swiss community in London

1953 Swiss Citizenship Act: allows women with a foreign spouse

to hold on to their Swiss citizenship

1966 Constitutional article for Swiss Abroad

1989 "Organisation of the Swiss Abroad" as a foundation

1992 Right to vote by mail

Voluntary old-age and survivors' insurance (AHV) for Swiss Abroad living outside of the

EU/EFTA

2015 Swiss Abroad Act

Missions of the Delegate of the CSA 1/2

1. Representation

- Representing the concerns of their Swiss community and its institutions in the CSA.
- Acting as a point of contact and source of information for compatriots in the represented area.

2. Communication

- Informing the represented Swiss associations and umbrella organisations about the OSA's activities and offers as well as about news from the OSA.
- Presence in the corresponding regional section of the Swiss Review.
- Maintaining contact with Swiss associations and Swiss institutions in the represented area.
- Maintaining contact with the Swiss representations (embassy, professional and honorary consulates) of the represented area.
- Promoting the political participation of the Swiss Abroad.
- Participation in activities to promote the Swiss presence abroad.




CSA UK ELECTIONS | KEY DATES

• The three candidates who secured the largest popular vote are elected as delegates to the CSA. These are the "Directly elected Delegates".


LUBS







- Joined the CSA in 2017 to help ensure Swiss people can maintain their political rights no matter where in the world they live.
- Main highlights: Meeting Swiss people from all around the world / Starting a working group to push for better representation of the Swiss abroad in the Swiss parliament.
- Tips for candidates:
 - To get elected: be very active on social media.
 - Once you're elected: be active and take initiatives / maintain relationships with fellow delegates between the sessions / never be afraid to speak up during the sessions.

- Came to the UK in 2004 from Lugano, Ticino.
- 20-year experience in Business Risk Consulting for FTSE 100
- Non-Executive Director and CEO of International Charity
- President of the New Helvetic Society

Why did I join OSA?

- To support the Swiss living in the UK to maintain (and improve!) their rights and provide them with the most up to date information.
- To push for a better representation of the Swiss Abroad within the current parliament.

Main Highlights?

 Obtained a better understanding of the issues that Swiss people are confronted with outside of Europe.

Tips for future candidates?

- To get elected: first, know exactly why you want to be a candidate and then be vocal on social media about it.
- Once elected: Be patient! Change does not happen immediately, and you need to keep pushing for what you believe in.





SARAH GRAND-CLÉMENT

- Joined as a delegate in May 2019
- Originally from Geneva, I moved to the UK in 2009 then again in 2013 and am now living in Cambridge
- I applied to be a delegate to help make a difference for the Swiss in the UK and represent the younger voices
- Highlight was attending the 2019
 Congress and helping OSA's campaign against the limitation referendum
- My tip: don't hesitate to stand for election even if you don't know many other Swiss in the UK
